Rivaroxaban Tablets contain the active substance rivaroxaban and is used in ac

- prevent blood clots in the veins after a high or knee replacement operation. Your doctor has prescribed this medicine for you because after an operation you are at an increased risk of getting blood clots treat blood clots in the veins of your legs (deep vein thrombosis) and in the blood vessels of your lungs (pulmonad embolism), and to prevent blood clots from re-occurring in the blood vessels of your legs and/or lungs.

Rivaroxaban belongs to a group of medicines called antithrombotic agents. works by blocking a blood clotting factor (factor Xa) and thus reducing the tenden of the blood to form clots.

3. How to take Rivaroxaban Tablets

 To prevent blood clots in the veins after a hip or knee replacement operation. The recommended dose is one 10mg tablet once a day.

 To treat blood clots in the viens of your legs and blood clots in the blood vessels of your lungs, and for preventing blood clots from re-occurring. After at least 6 months blood dot treatment, the recommended dose is either one 10mg tablet once a day or one 20mg tablet once a day yor doctor has prescribed you rivaroxaban 10mg once a day.

Swallow the tablet preferably with water Rivaroxaban Tablets can be taken with o without food.

If you have difficulty swallowing the tablet whole, talk to your doctor about other way to take Rivaroxaban Tablets. The tablet may be crushed and mixed with water or apple puree immediately before you take it. If necessary, your doctor may also give you the crushed Rivaroxaban tablet through a stomach tube.

When to take Rivaroxaban Tablets Take the tablet every day until your de tells you to stop. Try to take the tablet at the same time day to help you to remember it. Your doctor will decide how long you continue treatment.

To prevent blood clots in the veins after hip or knee replacement operation: Take the first tablet 6-10 hours after you operation.

If you have had a major hip operation you will usually take the tablets for 5 weeks. If you have had a major knee operation yowill usually take the tablets for 2 weeks.

If you take more Rivaroxaban Tablets than you should Contact your doctor immediately if you have taken too many Rivaroxaban Tablet Taking too much Rivaroxaban Tablets increases the risk of bleeding.

If you forget to take Rivaroxaban Tablets
If you have missed a dose, take it as soon as
you remember. Take the next tablet on the
following day and then carry on taking a
tablet once a day as normal.
Do not take a double dose to make up for a
forgotten tablet.

4. Possible side effects

Like other similar medicines to reduce the formation of blood clots, Rivaroxaban Tablets may cause bleeding which may potentially be life threatening. Excessive bleeding may lead to a sudden drop in blood pressure (shock). In some cases, the bleeding may not be obvious. es, the

Tell your doctor immediately if you experience any of the following side effects:

6. Contents of the pack and other information

- What Rivaroxaban Tablets contain

 The active substance is rivaroxaban. Each tablet contains 10mg of rivaroxaban.
 The other ingredients are:
 Tablet core: microcrystalline cellulose, lactose monohydrate, sodium laurilsulphate, hypromellose 2910, croscarmellose sodium, magnesium stearate. See section 2 "Rivaroxaban Tablets contain lartose and sodium"
 - Tablets contain lactose and sodium". Tablet film coat: hypromellose 2910, titanium dioxide (E 171), macrogol 3350, iron oxide red (E 172).

What Rivaroxaban Tablets look like and contents of the pack Rivaroxaban 10mg Film-Coated Tablets are pink, round, biconvex (6 mm diameter), engraved with "10" on one side and plain on the other side.
