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Patient Information

If used during pregnancy, etrasimod can harm the unborn baby. **Do not use etrasimod if you are pregnant, if you are trying to become pregnant or if you could become pregnant and are not using effective contraception.**

Before you start treatment with this medicine, your doctor will:

- Explain to you the risk of taking etrasimod while pregnant
- Ask you to do a pregnancy test to ensure you are not pregnant. Pregnancy tests will also be checked during treatment.

Additionally, make sure you:

- Ask your doctor for advice before taking etrasimod if you are pregnant or breastfeeding, think you may be pregnant or are planning to have a baby

- Use effective contraception while taking this medicine and for at least 14 days after you stop taking it (ask your doctor about reliable methods of contraception)
- Stop etrasimod at least 14 days before pregnancy is planned
- Tell your doctor straight away if you do become pregnant while taking this medicine, and for at least 14 days after you stop taking it. Your doctor will likely stop treatment and pre-natal checks will be performed to monitor the health of the unborn baby
- Do not breastfeed while you are taking etrasimod to avoid a risk of side effects for the baby as the medicine may pass into breast milk
- If you stop taking etrasimod, tell your doctor right away if your disease-related symptoms get worse, as there is a possibility that the disease may return

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Reporting of Side Effects

If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor, pharmacist or nurse. This includes any possible side effects not listed in the package leaflet.
